# Treasurer's Report for Committee Meeting 27th July 2023

The Mixed Greensomes was slightly over budget, due to low numbers attending.

The Presidents Cup was well attended but overspent by £246, with catering £5 per head higher than budget.

The home match against the Ladies was overspent by £53.50. Catering £2 per head over budget.

At home to Warwickshire, the overspend was £135 – catering £5.50 per head over budget.

Sundry items include £60 for the Glouces tershire match trophy. Also, Colin Whittle has just claimed web costs of £136 which he paid in December 2021! This will come up again this coming December.

There is a recurring theme here. We knew catering costs would jump this year, but the jumps have been larger than expected!

You can see that we are currently £724 worse than budget, and I expect this to increase. We budgeted a loss of £811 this year – the actual loss will be in four figures.

We will be increasing fees next year.

# THE FUTURE ROLE OF THE MATCH SECRETARY DISCUSSION DOCUMENT

The aim of this document for debate is to produce, by dividing the current Match Secretary's role, two acceptable and compatible roles that would inter-lock seamlessly to produce an efficient model, not too time consuming for either person involved.

# ROLE 1 - FIXTURES AND TOURS SECRETARY

# JANUARY - MARCH

- 1. Write to all the Oxfordshire Golf Clubs hosting our events in the current season, re-confirming our fixtures.
- Write to all the other Counties, re-confirming times, dates and venues of our matches in the current season - both home and away.
- 3. Draft the schedule for all matches and events for the following year.
- Arrange all dates and venues for all matches and events, both with opposing Counties and Oxfordshire host clubs.
- 5. Circulate all playing members with the coming season's matches, seeking their bids for places.
- 6. Maintain the working Excel spreadsheet of bids received as they come in.
- 7. Select and circulate teams for the 14 non-Cornwall matches.
- 8. Forward Excel spreadsheet to the Match Secretary for his use in selection processes for the 14 non-Cornwall matches.
- 9. Finalise all details for the current year's Cornwall tour, including payments, match selection, etc.
- Begin discussions with the Vice-Captain for his Autumn tour the following year.
- 11. Provided he wishes, administer the current Captain's September tour.

# APRIL - AUGUST

1. Assist with matches whenever required, but only when requested so to do.

# AUGUST - DECEMBER

- Confirm and organise September matches with Cornwall and also with the host Oxfordshire Golf Clubs.
- 2. Select and circulate teams for the Cornish matches.
- If it is the wish of the current Vice-Captain, finalise all details, including payments etc., for the current Captain's autumn tour.

# **ROLE 2** – MATCH SECRETARY

# MARCH - AUGUST

- 1. Approximately 5 6 weeks ahead of each of the remaining 14 matches;
  - a. For home matches, confirm date and times with the host Golf Club.
  - b. Agree menu, with prices, and inform Treasurer.
  - c. For all matches, confirm venue, date and arrival time for all matches with the opposition.
  - d. Select team from the Excel spreadsheet a simple "copy and paste" exercise.
  - e. Circulate selected team by email, with instructions; again "copy and paste" from previous such emails.
  - Keep a check on positive responses and find replacements for any drop-outs.
  - g. Select pairings and then exchange with opposition ahead of the match.
  - h. Prepare match day guide for the Match Manager.
  - Maintain record of match results provided by return of the team sheet by the Match Day Manager.
  - j. (I have a very simple check sheet of tasks for matches which (so far!) has prevented any mishaps or oversights.)

This, at first sight, might appear lopsided in leaving the Fixtures Secretary with the bulk of the work but, in reality, it is probably only around 55/45%.

That's as I see it working to the benefit of both people, whilst neither detracting from efficiency, nor creating the risk of "too many cooks" types of errors or omissions. However, everything herein is open for debate and addition or amendment.

If these proposals acceptable to Committee, I would be prepared to remain in Role 1 for the foreseeable future.

Clothing report. July 2023.

Waiting for confirmation that the clothing prices to us are now firming up and will then have a number of things to correct on the web page. Understandably, Colin prefers to do the whole thing in one go than do piece meal.

The blazers that came into stock have all been sold. There is one order in the pipeline, due to delivery charges I am waiting for another to come along, as ordering 2 together avoids a delivery charge.

The shirts order has now been collected.

We have a provisional order for a playing jacket, manufacturer has now changed the style, so need to see a sample to check it is still suitable.

One of our captains, who seems very picky concerning the shirts we supply, is going to supply his own shirt to be embroidered. The current supplier is able to do this at the moment, so will be doing this. As we have offered this service to current and past Captains and Presidents, while this can continue, it is a solution to handle different requirements, so trust the Committee are happy for this to continue as it does give us the control for colours and suitability?

Can committee members be pro active in encouraging Captains to use the Website as a source of information, and in the instance of clothing be clear to our members that orders need to be done by email, so there is a clear trail to follow, as there have been instances where a verbal request has been made, then denied when attempting to supply.

On a positive note, most captains have been very cooperative in helping me get clothing to the recipient in time for matches and events, avoiding the need to incur delivery charges.

This is very helpful, and if the committee are all in agreement, can a general thank you be mentioned in a future email for the past, and likewise for the future help.

One other problem, which may be down to my personality, that happens, most captains think I am making a profit out of our service, it does lead to some interesting conversations.
